#### ABOUT OUR WETLABS

Each morning will cover different hoof types/pathology with the day's case reviews followed by wet lab demonstration with:

Club foot  
Long toe, under run heel  
Migrated hoof capsule  
Negative palmar angle  
Laminitis

- Trimming concepts to correct to the biomechanics of the foot will be emphasized.
- We demonstrate our defined trimming protocol incorporating variances for each "hoof type" to address individual hoof needs and support existing pathology.
- Pre and post podiatry x-rays will be performed, interpreted and discussed on-site as the farriery is accomplished to evaluate the efficacy of the farrier package.
- Venogram diagnostic procedure will be demonstrated and results interpreted and discussed
- Various therapeutic shoeing packages will be demonstrated in particular featuring our:

Cupped roller shoes that provide a moving breakover point (over COR) with a cup modification to stabilize laminae.

Casting (laminitis), Ultimates, and Nolan Hoof Plate technique (coffin bone fracture, hoof cracks) will be demonstrated with our enhanced protocols.

**EVENING EDUCATION SERIES** compliments the daily workshop subject material elaborating on the following topics:

- Navigating through "8" hoof types & common distortions in the equine distal limb.
- Navigating through the various stages of laminitis and appropriate protocols including subclinical versus clinical cases
